TAPSS Success Story—Giving Back

This spring, SPCC was thrilled to hear from a very special young woman who was in the TAPSS (Teen Age Parent Support Services) program 20 years ago and is now looking to give back to the program that helped her find her way as a young mom. At 16 years of age, Sheneiqua gave birth to a beautiful little boy, but found herself with very little support. A friend in the community told her about SPCC's TAPSS program and she called up to refer herself. For about 3 years, **Sheneiqua was actively involved in supportive counseling and case management services in the TAPSS program.** Over time, she became an influential peer leader to other young mothers in the program. She would often help organize group efforts and community service projects, and was known for putting a smile on anyone's face. In Sheneiqua's own words as a now 36 year-old woman, "I was given support and resources that set me on a path to job readiness and sisterhood. I still keep in contact with some of the other mothers. We have become life-long friends!"

Today, Sheneiqua is a successful young woman and a thriving mother to 3 children. She is also a published author of 2 novels and a workbook for aspiring writers. This summer, Sheneiqua will be organizing an event open to the public on **August 18, 2019 from 5-8 PM at the Rochester Brainery** (176 Ander son Ave, Rochester, NY 14607). The evening will highlight the works of local artists and authors, and will also include food, poetry reading, musical performances and a table where community members can learn about the TAPSS program and ways they can support Rochester's young mothers and their children. A portion of the \$20 admission price will be going directly to support the vital work of the TAPSS program. We are **honored to be highlighted and supported in such a unique way**, by a young woman who truly connected with our program and experienced the power of having someone believe in them despite challenging circumstances. We hope that you might come out on August 18 and support this meaningful event too!


